Dear Church Family,

Let's recognize that change is never easy. There will be moments of difficulty and resistance, and we might stumble. But those very challenges can lead to growth—if we stand together. Every one of us will be transformed through this journey, especially as leaders, whether we hold specific titles or not.



As we're reminded in Revelation 11:15, "The kingdom of the world will become the kingdom of our Lord and his Messiah, and he will reign forever and ever."


